- School of Business: At least 24 credits in 3000/4000 level courses including MGMT 4900 and BUSN 3002W must be earned *in residence* at the University, including no more than three independent study credits and three field study internship credits. At least 50% of the business credit hours required for the business degree must be earned while a student at the University of Connecticut. With the exception of UConn Faculty-Led Programs, Education Abroad courses may not be used to meet this requirement.
- College of Liberal Arts and Sciences: Students must earn a minimum of 30 credits in residence toward a degree at the University (study abroad courses count as in residence for CLAS). Students desiring to transfer credits should be aware of residence requirements in the individual schools and colleges, and should request necessary permissions in advance. Students seeking exceptions to any additional residence requirements of a school or college must petition the dean or director of the appropriate program from which they will earn their degree.
- Spanish Major: A minimum of 12 of the major credits must consist of Spanish courses taken in residence.

## Dual Degree Requirements

Both CLAS and Business require a minimum of 120 credits to earn a bachelor's degree. To obtain the dual degree, students must complete at least 30 credits in
addition to the 120.

- A single course may not satisfy more than one requirement.
- Students must take at least one "W" course as part of the required 24 Spanish credits.
